

TCEC Electrical Safety Month Poster Contest

Design a poster for TCEC Electrical Safety Month. Look up and down. What is on the ground? Be safe around pad mount transformers.

Pad mounted transformers are green metal boxes that contain the above ground portion of an underground electrical installation. Your home gets electricity in one of two ways: overhead or underground. If the distribution lines are underground, service pedestals and equipment may be housed in these outdoor boxes, cabinets, or larger enclosures called padmount transformers. The transformer's purpose is to reduce the voltage of incoming electricity to a lower voltage for your house. Never play around padmounts because they carry high voltages and are safe when locked, but they can be deadly if someone reaches inside. If you see one open call TCEC immediately 580.652.2418.
